CLARK STUDENTS IN THE 2015 NATIONAL MERIT® SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

STUART, FL (Oct. 17, 2014) -- Debra Kohuth, Principle of the Clark Advanced Learning Center, announced today that Bradford Blankman, Kate McMahon, Ronald Orr and Clark graduate Emily Kiner have been named Commended Students in the 2015 National Merit® Scholarship Program. A Letter of Commendation from the school and National Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC), which conducts the program, will be presented by the principal to these scholastically talented seniors.

Clark senior Bradford Blankman, resident of Stuart, is interested in a career in electrical engineering. Palm City resident and Clark senior Kate McMahon plans to pursue a career in political science or journalism. Another Clark senior, Ronald Orr of Hobe Sound is looking forward to a career in software engineering. Clark graduate Emily Kiner from Palm City is currently studying Pre-Dental at the University of Florida.

Located on the Chastain Campus of Indian River State College, Clark Advanced Learning Center is ranked as the top high school on the Treasure Coast and among the top ten high schools in Florida.
