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## 2022-2023 School Profile

### THE SCHOOL

In 2004, Clark Advanced Learning Center (Clark) was established as a charter high school in partnership with Martin County School District and Indian River State College to provide "middle majority" 10th, 11th, and 12th grade students with enhanced education and career training opportunities through access to a rigorous technology-enriched curriculum in a small school environment. Clark is located in southeastern Florida and serves 250 students. Approximately 15% of our students are on free/reduced lunch. For the fall semester of the 2020-2021 school year, students and their families were given the option of attending school in-person utilizing a hybrid model, or they could access all of their classes remotely from home. Students taking dual enrollment classes at Indian River State College had few options for in-person classes. Most were completely online or hybrid. Twenty-five percent of our students were entirely remote for fall of 2020. More than 90% of our students returned to a traditional, in-person schedule for the spring of 2021, and 100% of our students were in-person for the 2021-2022 school year.

Enrollment for 2022-2023 in grades 10 through 12 totals 250 and is distributed as follows:

### COMPUTATION OF GPA & RANK

Students are cumulatively ranked at the end of each semester based on their Honors Point Average (HPA). Students are given both a GPA (unweighted grade point average) and an HPA (weighted honors point average). The GPA is calculated based on the following scale for a 1 credit course:

A—4.0 B—3.0 C—2.0 D—1.0 F—0.0

Class rank is computed via a weighted quality point system. The points are generated based upon both the grade earned and the instructional level difficulty of each completed course, as indicated below. Class rank is determined by computing the weighted grade point average of all high school credit classes taken by a student.
