Handbook Highlights/ Reminders

I'm not sure if we can blame the chilly temps or the holidays nearing, but it seems students are having a tough time arriving on time for classes recently. Students receive detentions for a certain threshold of tardies within a one or two week span. If detention does not help to change the behavior, more significant consequences will be issued. Traffic is heavier for winter, so adjust those driving times accordingly!

From page 10 of our handbook: Tardiness is defined as an arrival to class after the designated start time. Students arriving late to a Clark class for any reason must report to the Student Services office in the Knowledge Room for a late pass. Tardies will be identified as excused/unexcused in FOCUS according to the same guidelines as absences. Progressive interventions may be initiated by the school administration and/or the Intervention Planning Team.
