Remote Learning Option: The remote learning option was introduced as a *temporary* learning format as a result of the Coronavirus pandemic. As is the expectation for their peers learning in traditional classrooms, students participating in remote learning are expected to actively participate in their lessons and be engaged in school. **Engaged = CAMERAS ON!**

Students are eligible to participate in remote learning **only** in the following scenarios:

- A parent/guardian has registered them for the remote learning option with their school
- They are currently following quarantine or isolation protocol at the direction of DOH Martin or a healthcare professional
- They are sick and staying home due to symptoms, but are well enough to participate in remote learning from home temporarily. <u>Students must provide a note from their parent or physician if they will be temporarily participating in remote learning due to illness</u>.
- They or a member of the household is symptomatic, awaiting testing results or has tested positive for COVID-19.

Parents and students- we welcome students to be on campus for their live log in classes. Too many students are in cars traveling between campus and home or getting lunch! This is a safety issue and also not good to be able to take notes and truly participate in active learning!

ART1201C – Color and Design: In this hands on course, students will learn the fundamentals of 2D art and design. Students with an interest in art and/or design should enroll in this foundational level course that will allow them to learn art and design vocabulary, work with various drawing and painting media to create finished original projects, and how to modify designs based upon evaluation and critique. DIG1000 – Digital Media Principles: In this course, students will be introduced to the world of digital media. Various Adobe software is introduced, including programs such as Adobe Photoshop, Illustrator, and InDesign. Students will gain insight on the skills needed to become a digital artist or designer, learn how to develop a project using the design process, and learn valuable critical and creative thinking skills. DIG2116 – Photoshop Level 2: This course is for students with an interest in taking their Photoshop skills to the next level. In Photoshop Level 2, students will learn how to elevate and expand upon the skills learned in Photoshop 1. Techniques covered in this course include how to create, edit, and enhance digital images for print, web, and multimedia output with a focus on building advanced photo illustrations, digital paintings, and graphic and web design layouts, and more.

PGY1800 – Principles of Digital Photography: In this foundational course, students will learn current digital photography techniques and theories. Contemporary photography theories and genres, the history of photography, and art and design vocabulary will be explored as a foundation for the technical skills that students will learn and practice in this course. Current camera types, editing software, and workflow processes will be explored in order to enable students to craft successful photographs from concept to completion.

Reminder: high school students must receive 6 hours or more of education related to substance abuse, human trafficking, suicide awareness, and other issues related to mental wellness. ALL students are required to complete the modules in a program called Suite 360. Students will log in with their Clark email address as the username and 4300# as the password.
