## **Laptop collection procedures:**

Option 1: Students should return all equipment to Mr. McCrory after the conclusion of their last classes but no later than Tuesday, May 25, 2021.

Option 2: provided each student and parent/guardian completes the following action steps prior to Tuesday, May 25, 2021 students may keep their school issued MacBook through May 25, 2022.

Working in partnership with Martin County Emergency Management and the Medical Reserve Corps, the Florida Department of Health in Martin is hosting a series of special clinics to offer the COVID-19 Pfizer vaccine. Vaccinations will be offered at the Treasure Coast Square Mall, 3066 NW Federal Highway, Jensen Beach, May 26, 27, 28 and 29. The clinics are offered on a walk-in basis and everyone age 12 and older is eligible to receive the vaccine, which is administered as a two-shot series, approximately 21-days apart. A parent or guardian must be present for those age 17 and younger.
